Mayo Clinic College of Medicine, School of Health Sciences Master of Nurse Anesthesia Program Update

Another year has passed and changes in the economy and life have taken place which impact all of us. Although the economy is asking everyone to be more cost effective, we have been very careful not to make changes that would lessen our ability to provide our students with a great education.

Last fall Irv Plitzuweit, PhD taught his last nurse anesthesia chemistry class. Irv started teaching chemistry to our students in 1995. For 14 years he has been, not only our chemistry instructor, but he has also been a strong supporter of many students as they progressed through the program and throughout their careers. We send a huge "thank you" to Irv for his commitment and support of our program and students.

Although it was sad to say "good-bye" to Irv, we are excited to be welcoming Dr. Jeff Pasternak as our new chemistry instructor. Jeff is a neuro anesthesiologist who had an interest in chemistry in his undergraduate days and has continued throughout his medical education

and career as an anesthesiologist. Jeff will be using a new textbook and has graciously agreed to pioneer the use of Blackboard for our program. He plans to place a large amount of the course material on Blackboard, our new electronic communication/teaching tool.

This past year we developed a core group of instructors for the Simulation Center. Eric Larson (Class of 2005), Shannon Benson (Class of 2008), Robyn Finney (Class of 2003), Cory Groves (Class of 2007) and Erin Martin (Class of 2005) make up this enthusiastic group. As a result of this group's efforts, we are looking forward to enhanced simulation experiences for our students.

This past September, 26 members of the Class of 2011 started their educational journey to become a CRNA. We have selected another 26 enthusiastic, bright and motivated RNs to start the program September 14, 2009. For the Class of 2012, we selected 19 Minnesotans. The other 7 students will come from WI, ND, UT, GA, CA, and WA.

Last year eighteen senior students presented their research project posters at the AANA National Meeting (Minneapolis). Again this year, all poster submissions were selected for presentation at the Annual AANA Meeting (San Diego). A total of 16 seniors traveled to San Diego to present their research projects via posters. This coming October, the seniors will also exhibit their posters at the State MANA Meeting and again at the 35th Annual Mayo Clinic Nurse Anesthesia Seminar (November 4-6, 2009).

As I shared with you last year, we continue to cautiously explore the steps needed to become a clinical doctorate (DNP) program; possibly in 2013. A few years after the start of the DNP Program, we plan to develop a DNP Degree Completion program for those of you who want to continue your graduate education.

Graduation 2009

Graduation ceremonies were held on March 14, 2009, for members of the Class of 2009. Again this year, it was standing room only in Phillips Hall. Wayne (Nick) Nicholson, M.D., Pharm D. was the invited graduation speaker. Dr. Nick's message to the graduates and the audience was just as enthusiastic and powerful as the lectures he provided to the graduates in his Advanced Pharmacology I course, their Advanced Anesthetic Considerations course and a senior pharmacology review.

This year twenty-five SRNAs were granted their Master of Nurse Anesthesia (MNA) degree. Two CRNA Degree Completion students also received their MNA degree. "Congratulations to all" for a job well done, in both your classroom and clinical endeavors.

The Class of 2009 has done very well on their certification exams. 100% of this year's graduates can now call themselves CRNAs!





of family members together. We laughed, cried, grieved, struggled, offered advice and spent time in silence not knowing what to say sometimes. We were passionate about each others success, not just in school, but in life.

> We talked about rationing toilet paper, shared meals, saved cookie frosting for classmates and went to the occasional happy hour. Even those who chose not to drink alcohol came along and spent that hour being very happy; or sharing our misery. We helped each other move from apartment to apartment, did secret Santa and

brought enough treats to class most days to feed twice and many people as necessary. Coffee and caffeine consumption was out of control to maintain the long hours mentioned earlier. Water and bathroom breaks were always welcome back then; they

> still are. Small groups exercised together, watched each others pets and baby sat each others children. As classmates and friends our lives were intertwined.

I have a very rose colored memory but it wasn't always easy spending all that time together. We

had an occasional disagreement within the group. It might be that the ride to school was late in picking someone up...again. Maybe we just got tired of

giving of ourselves so we kept to ourselves for a day or two. What ever it was that came between us now and then it didn't take us long to find our way back to the group we relied on so heavily. I think it was Karen who said once,"Oh just shut up and make up so we can get on with it." (leave for
